ible Center's mission is simple yet profound: we love God, we love people, and we live like Jesus.

The vision extends beyond merely existing within the community; we are dedicated to serving and uplifting it. Through a powerful combination of faith and action, Bible Center has worked since 1956 to transform the community of Homewood, with the goal being to make it a reflection of God's grace and love.

We believe in the power of education, employment, entrepreneurship, and the renewal of the environment (in our case the adaptive reuse of vacant and abandoned buildings) to create positive change. We are committed to actively working towards improving lives, fostering hope, and building a stronger community.

The Oasis Project is the community outreach and economic development division of Bible Center Church. Through our various programs, we work to create bright spots of opportunity and growth to help change the life trajectory of people who live, work, learn, worship, or play in the community of Homewood.

Our approach to education is holistic and genera-



tional. The core education programs include Maker's Clubhouse (TMC) out-of-school time, TMC Early Learning Center, Oasis Farm and Fishery, and Oasis Transportation. Serving children ages three to seventeen, the programs and services are designed to foster a positive self-identity, instill a lifelong love for learning, and cultivate a sense of care and responsibility for the community.

Many children in our community enter kindergarten without prior exposure to structured learning environments. This lack of early educational experiences often leaves them unaware of their own potential and can make it difficult for them to view learning as an exciting and rewarding activity. TMC Early Learning Center's goal is to bridge this gap, inspire a love for learning, and develop children who are problem solvers, world changers and compassionate people.

Out-of-school time and early learning programming offer exciting STEAM (science, technology, engineering, agriculture, and math) enrichment activities to encourage 'big' dreams of being innovators, builders, and creators. These programs help children develop strong critical thinking and problem-solving skills.

A key component of TMC's STEAM curriculum is the agriculture and nutrition education provided by Oasis Farm and Fishery. Understanding where food comes from and how the various ingredients and nutritional values affect how we learn, think, feel, and behave is central to a person's well-being.


In recent years, The Maker's Clubhouse has built on its core value of creating a safe space for learning by offering enhanced social and emotional learning (SEL) daily. Through age-appropriate activities and mentorship, we aim to nurture well-rounded individuals who are confident, curious, and compassionate.

Bible Center identified early on that great programs and resources in a vibrant region like Pittsburgh mean little when children or youth cannot get to the opportunities. Children in communities with low-income households, budget-restricted schools, and safety concerns find it more

Number of Children That Have Attended







difficult to access opportunities. Oasis Transportation was developed in response to this critical need. The program serves over 1,000 children and youth each year, transporting them to school or after-school, and enrichment activities like museums, theater, sports, or college tours.

From early childhood development to teen leadership initiatives, The Oasis Project education programs provide a supportive environment where children can grow, explore, and discover their potential. The guiding principle is to lay a strong foundation for the children's and youths' future success, both personally and within the broader community.

The Maker's Clubhouse Green, STEAM & Play Camp provided engaging summer learning for 119 children from 28 different schools, offering a mix of academic enrichment and physical activity. Campers participated in weekly field trips, swimming outings, and activities from 10 community partners focused on STEAM and outdoor education. These hands-on experiences helped campers strengthen their academic skills and return to school with confidence and a positive mindset.

Building Strong Foundations for an Exceptional Future:

The Importance of Quality Early Childhood Education

he beginning of the school year is always very exciting! Even though my children are long past needing back-to-school supplies, I love to see all that parents put into getting their children ready for school. New clothes, fresh braids, and backpacks filled with all the tools needed to have a great school year! As an educator, my heart fills with joy as I think about all that these children will become but I also know succeeding in life takes much more. A high-quality early childhood education has a profound impact on how children perform in kindergarten but also sets the stage for lifelong learning and success. This is the reason The Maker's Clubhouse Early Learning Center was founded.

In the earliest years of life, children's brains develop at a phenomenal rate — forming more than one million neural connections each second. This period of intense growth is influenced significantly by their interactions with the world around them. Enrolling a child in a high-quality preschool program is an investment in that child's future. The early learning environment encourages exploration, into kindergarten and



expression, which all lead to academic, social, and emotional growth.

The educators at The Maker's Clubhouse Early Learning Center understand that preschool-aged children are extremely receptive to learning, so they strive to expose them to many learning experiences each day. Through those experiences, the children begin to understand their likes, interests, and strengths. Our teachers spend time daily observing and assessing each child so learning experiences are developed that engage and maximize the learning potential of each child. Early exposure to dynamic learning environments can spark curiosity and instill a love of learning that children carry into kindergarten and throughout their lives.

The Importance of Child-Centered Early Educational Experiences

We know that children who develop strong reading and math skills in early childhood are better equipped for academic and life success. A Montessori-inspired, child-centered approach to teaching reading and math to young learners is showing significant improvements in a child's readiness for kindergarten and beyond. Hands-on and self-directed lessons with a focus on using concrete materials and exploration to build a deep under-

standing of concepts nurture academic skills in fun and interactive ways that engage the young learners in their success.

Fostering a Positive Racial Identity

It is essential for children, especially Black children, to grow up with a positive sense of their racial identity. This fosters confidence and an understanding of their unique heritage and potential. Celebrating the students' diversity and incorporating materials

and stories that reflect their backgrounds, ensures that every child sees themselves as an exceptional learner. By affirming their identity, students are empowered to embrace their capabilities and strive for excellence. The explorative nature of an early learning environment is ideal for instilling a positive racial identity in young learners before they enter a more structured and systematic learning environment.

Social Skills and Emotional Intelligence

Beyond academics, a preschool experience offers children their first community outside of family. In these settings, children learn invaluable social skills such as sharing, cooperation, and empathy. These skills are essential as they navigate school life and beyond, impacting their ability to communicate, collaborate, and understand others' perspectives.

The Role of Environmental Engagement

Engaging with the environment plays a crucial role in a child's development. Going beyond the obvious need for physical activity and exploration in playground and field games and engaging children in gardening and cooking classes fosters a sense of responsibility for

Developing a Child's Resilience:

How social and Emotional Learning Can Prevent Violence

he Maker's Clubhouse is helping children build true resilience, not just superficial toughness, through Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) in its out-of-school time programs.

The more than 175 children who participate in The Maker's Clubhouse afterschool program live, learn, and play in and near Pittsburgh's Homewood neighborhood, which sees a disproportionate amount of community violence. Despair, fear, and anger are reasonable emotions for one to have when witnessing or hearing violent activity. The fight or flight instinct is triggered, and without intervention, it will at best manifest as disruptive or aggressive behavior or withdrawal, which may show up as a lack of focus or manifest in school absenteeism. Genuine resilience builds community and compassion and helps people journey through difficulty, loss, and trauma.

Since 2021, students have engaged in daily SEL lessons. In 2022, with support from a grant from the

City of Pittsburgh Stop the Violence fund, the program expanded to help develop resilience in coping with trauma, emphasizing community support, self-awareness, emotional processing, and advocacy skills.

The three-pronged approach offers the students guidance and support, an engaging skill- and awareness-building curriculum, and explores hope, understanding, and advocacy through creative projects.

In the 2022-23 academic year, in addition to the curriculum activities, parents/caregivers joined in a learning experience, and the 4th and 5th-grade students participated in a 3-month-long creative and advocacy project.

Parenting While Black (PWB), a project at the University of Pittsburgh, was offered in the Fall of 2022 and Spring of 2023 to two cohorts of eight parents. PWB is a group intervention that provides parents with tools to both support their children's healthy development and their own wellness. The program's goals are to 1) Promote positive racial identity, 2) Help children cope with experiences of discrimination, 3) Encourage school and home-based educational involvement as Black parents, and 4) promote intergenerational mental wellness and racial stress coping.

"Through My Lens: What It's Like To Be A Child In My Neighborhood," was a Photovoice project where students used their new photography and journaling skills to share their experiences and leverage their stories to advocate for change.

"Heroes Among Us: Homewood Stories Past, Present, and Future," explored the essence of heroism within our community. The Spring 2024 project, led by Dr. Khirsten Scott, Assistant Professor of Education at the University of Pittsburgh, taught students through their newly acquired research and interviewing skills that genuine heroism is found in everyday interactions when people are loving, courageous, kind, and resilient. Stay tuned, with generous support from the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinquency (PCCD) and the City of Pittsburgh's Stop the Violence Office, The Maker's Clubhouse is entering its third year of providing this essential program.
